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As a scholar studying the rule of law, the *Justice* Preview provides clear ideas on the concept of justice and rights and their inter-relationships. There must also be a cultural change in society. My work with social movements, teaching and other community activities are actually different forms of civic education aiming to shape the legal culture of the Hong Kong society to embrace the value of justice.

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
